County is being remodeled to have bedrooms and a bath on the second floor to accommodate more guests.




Grandkids



Kai and Kiera are thriving students, with Kai in Second Grade and Kiera in


Kindergarten at Harding Elementary, a few blocks from their house in El Cerrito. They are great playing with their two younger cousins.
